



Service Offering

THE MANOR is a 14 bedded unit that supports males and females with a diagnosis of acquired brain injury (ABI) and/or Mental Health issues who also have complex nursing needs and physical disabilities.

The majority of people we support on an ongoing basis suffer from limb paralysis and are wheelchair bound. We have hoists in every room, large spacious areas and widened doorways for accessibility. Croham Place provides an in house Physiotherapy service led by a Physiotherapist registered with both the Chartered Society of Physiotherapy (CSP) and the Health & Care Professions Council.

THE BEECHES is a 12 bedded unit that supports males only with an ABI and/or Mental Health diagnosis. Individuals in our care may present with a variety of neurological (Dementia, Huntington's, Korsakoff's and Alzheimer's disease) and Mental Health (Schizophrenia, Schizoaffective Disorder) diagnoses.

NIGHTINGALES is a care home with twenty four hours nursing located in Croydon, Greater London, supporting up to nine working age gentlemen who have a Neurocognitive/Acquired Brain Injury condition and Mental Health presentation which affects their behaviour, ability to process information and ability to function independently. Individuals in our care may also present with a variety of physical and or neurological diagnoses such as any type of Dementia, Huntington's, Korsakoff's and Alzheimer's disease.

Units:

THE BEECHES - 12 BEDS, ALL MALE UNIT

THE MANOR - 14 BEDS, MALE & FEMALE UNIT

NIGHTINGALES - 9 BEDS, MALE UNIT

Inclusion Criteria:

We are able to support Service Users who:

HAVE A DIAGNOSIS OF ABI/NEUROCOGNITIVE DISORDERS

MAY HAVE A MENTAL HEALTH DIAGNOSIS

MAY HAVE PHYSICAL DISABILITIES AND/OR COMPLEX NEEDS

MAY HAVE A RANGE OF COMPLEX CARE NEEDS

MAY HAVE BEHAVIOURS THAT CHALLENGE

MAY HAVE RISKS REQUIRING A MORE ROBUST COMMUNITY PLACEMENT

MAY HAVE A FORENSIC OR SIGNIFICANT RISK HISTORY

MAY BE INFORMAL, SUBJECT TO DOLS, CONDITIONAL DISCHARGES, CTO'S OR ON LICENCE AS DIRECTED BY THE PAROLE BOARD

Assessment Process

Once a referral is made to our service we will review the information and if appropriate we will aim to assess the Service User within two working days. We will endeavour to complete and send the assessment report, together with a detailed pre-admission care plan and cost breakdown within three working days following the face to face assessment. We work closely with our Service Users, customers, current placement teams and families to facilitate a smooth transition into the service.

Our Aims & Approach:



Deliver care that has a holistic approach and considers the nursing, cognitive, social, emotional, psychological and physical issues affecting each Service User along with the individual's long and short-term goals.



Wherever possible maximise recovery from the physical, cognitive, and psychological impairments the individual may present with.



Provide comprehensive, person-centred care through an interdisciplinary approach based on communication and collaboration not just with the individual but with the involvement of relevant family members, carers and care-coordinators.



We aim to remove or minimise restrictions wherever possible to each Service User's participation in daily life activities.



Provide one-to-one focused rehabilitation and development of independent living skills where possible and support the use of daily activities of living, as required.



Provide ongoing assessment and review behavioural risks, mental health related risks, physical health risks and where indicated forensic risk assessments.
